### 1. Parli-Pro

- 100: Is the statement made by someone asking for the end of debate.
- 200: Is the request made by a legislator who wishes to ask more than one question regarding the legislation.
- 300: Is the statement made when you need to excuse yourself from the floor.
- 400: This is called to request a standing count by the body.
- 500: The motion to remove a bill from debate indefinitely.

### 2. How A Bill Becomes A Law

- 100: The body who assigns the order of the docket.
- 200: The place where the bill is debated prior to appearing on the floor of the house or senate.
- 300: Percentage of votes a bill must have to be passed.
- 400: Can either sign or veto a piece of legislation.
- 500: The set of laws that rule Washington State.

### 3. Y&G Positions

- 100: The smaller of the two legislative bodies.
- 200: The person who educates legislators about issues in hopes to sway their opinions.
- 300: The individual responsible for calling roll and recording attendance on the floor.
- 400: These are 6 of the 8 positions elected in Olympia.
- 500: This is the only position that may be held in conjunction with another elected position.
