The Program

Get Engaged places young adults ages 18-29 on boards and commissions each fall. Serving in an advisory capacity to the Mayor and City Council, commissioners help shape policy decisions, make recommendations, and provide citizen participation in city government. *Get Engaged*, a partnership between the City of Seattle and Metrocenter YMCA, is dedicated to cultivating the next generation of leaders and to highlighting the importance and value of youth voice in city affairs. **Even if you've never considered a role in public service, our city needs you. Experience doesn't matter. Passion does.**

Your Commitment: Two Parts

1. **Board commitment:** *Get Engaged* participants are appointed to serve a one-year term (September 2009 – September 2010) as a full voting member on a city board or commission (see participating boards on following page). Participants agree to attend regularly scheduled board meetings and contribute 6-10 hours each month to committee meetings.
2. ***Get Engaged* commitment:** In addition to board service, *Get Engaged* participants:
 - Attend an overnight retreat in the fall (dates TBA)
 - Meet with your *Get Engaged* colleagues once each month for skill-building, current issue discussions, and an opportunity to reflect on your experience.
 - Are connected to and learn from a peer group of civically-minded people ages 18-29.

3. Your current resume.

ARTS COMMISSION

The Seattle Arts Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the Mayor's Office of Arts & Cultural Affairs to promote and encourage public programs that further the development, public awareness, and interest in the fine and performing arts in Seattle. The commission accomplishes this through the purchase of artworks and art services, by providing technical assistance and information related to the arts, and advising the City in the development of cultural policy. [15 members]

BICYCLE ADVISORY BOARD

Advise the Mayor, the City Council, and all departments and offices of the City on matters related to bicycling and the impacts that actions of the City may have upon bicycling, and contribute to all aspects of the City's planning processes insofar as they relate to bicycling. [11 members]

CITIZEN'S TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY BOARD (CTTAB)

Advise the Mayor and the City Council on issues pertaining to telecommunications, including cable television access, electronic communications and regulatory issues regarding wire and wireless communication systems. CTTAB works with the community on technology access issues and civic engagement.

***DESIGN COMMISSION**

Provide professional design advice to the Mayor, City Council, and all city departments on capital improvements. The Design Commission reviews projects funded in any part with City money and/or on City land and makes recommendations as the projects develop. [10 members]

DESIGN REVIEW BOARDS

Assist in evaluation of projects subject to Design Review based upon neighborhood and Citywide specific design guidelines. [35 members (divided into 7 boards)]

Meetings: Twice a month, during an evening, on a regular schedule: 1st and 3rd Tuesdays, 2nd and 4th Mondays, etc.

HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

Provide equal opportunities for minorities, aging, and persons with disabilities through the enforcement of City ordinances pertaining to equal opportunity and affirmative action. [16 members]

***LANDMARKS PRESERVATION BOARD**

Identification of potential landmarks, decisions on landmark designations, and recommendations to the City Council on landmark controls for adoption into designating ordinances. Landmark designation is recognized

and used not only to preserve cultural resources, but to positively influence future development of the neighborhood. [11 members]

Advise the Mayor, the City Council, and all departments on all matters related to pedestrian safety, access, and encouragement. [11 members]

***PIONEER SQUARE PRESERVATION BOARD**

Preserve, protect and enhance the historic and architectural character of Pioneer Square. Review applications for changes in use and design in the District and make recommendations to the Director of the Dept. of Neighborhoods. Make recommendations to the Mayor, the City Council, and any public or private agencies concerning land use in the District. [10 members]

*** PLANNING COMMISSION**

Make recommendations to the Mayor, City Council and other City departments on the city's broad planning goals and policies, and on such plans for the city as its present and future development may require. [15 members]

SEATTLE COMMISSION FOR SEXUAL MINORITIES

Advise the Mayor, Council and departments about sexual minority issues, recommend policies and legislation, bring the sexual minority communities and the larger Seattle community together through long-ranged projects, and ensure that City departments fairly and equitably address sexual minority concerns as individuals and as a protected class. [16 members]
